- You occupy a role that allows you the agency to influence change within your organization and access to use AI frameworks/tools.

1. Take initial steps to move toward an ISP role:

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- a. Become part of a grade-level team, Professional Learning Community (PLC), improvement team, data team, or other service opportunities in your organization that allows you to suggest strategies, tools, and ideas for your work.
 - b. Partner with an organizational leader or mentor to discuss the information you learn on the AI Hub.
 - c. Start an Implementation Science learning group.
 - d. Volunteer with a community organization or group focused on systems change (e.g., your child's school, faith-based organization, non-profit).
2. Apply your growing knowledge of implementation practice within this setting to advocate for using AI frameworks/tools.
 3. Build on these experiences to advocate for your own implementation support leadership.
